



Just another big hurdle

AGAINST the odds, Kelly Cartwright has reached great heights representing her country and breaking a world record.

But the Geelong Paralympian has her sights set on a new goal — climbing Africa's highest mountain on one leg.

Fresh from slashing almost four seconds off the world Paralympic 200m record at an international meeting in Darwin this month, Ms Cartwright, 19, has vowed to climb Mt Kilimanjaro in Tanzania.

Ms Cartwright said the 5895m climb will take four days on the way up and three days to descend.

"I'm a bit scared, but I'm looking forward to it as well," she said.

She hopes to raise \$5000 from her July climb to donate to the Humpty Dumpty Foundation to buy medical equipment for children's hospitals.
